Costa Rica: Birds and Art with Susan Brickner-Wren

Feb. 4 to 11, 2027

7 Nights/8 Days

With 943 avian species recorded on its territory to this day, Costa Rica is one of the most diverse countries in terms of bird species per square mile in the World. Four of these species are strictly limited to Costa Rica's geographical boundaries and more than one hundred regional endemic species are shared with the neighboring countries. We have designed this program to maximize the opportunities for the best birdwatching in combination with daily art workshops. This selection of destinations combines field work sessions, feeding stations, diverse landscapes and culture for exciting opportunities in field sketching, plein air painting and photography. With this wide variety of habitats and subjects comes an equally broad range of techniques for watercolor and sketching. Instruction will include perspective and light, color mixing and line quality, composition and focus. Susan's work ranges from field sketching to large studio pieces, from birds and botanicals to portraits. She utilizes reference photos and field notes to follow up with studio pieces. Susan will share techniques for successful photography and watercolor painting, demonstrating a common base to help participants build confidence in the field. This program is flexible to ensure that there will be time to relax and enjoy the grounds of the lodges.

Tour Overview

Day 1, Feb. 4: Arrival to San Jose, meet your guide and transfer to Hotel Bougainvillea. Lodging: Bougainvillea.

Day 2, Feb. 5: Drive to the highlands, en route stop at Paraiso de Quetzales to enjoy Highland species of hummingbirds. Lodging: Gema del Bosque.

Day 3, Feb. 6: Resplendent Quetzals and highland endemics. The Photography setups at Batsu Gardens are perfect to enjoy and have another art workshop. Lodging: Gema del Bosque.

Day 4, Feb. 7: In the morning walking along the beautiful waterfall trail with opportunities to sketch and enjoy the landscape and birds. In the afternoon visit the Paramo. Lodging: Gema del Bosque.

Day 5, Feb. 8: Early birding at the lodge grounds and head towards Arenal. Arrive to the lodge in the afternoon to relax and enjoy the grounds. Lodging: Brisas del Arenal.

Day 6, Feb. 9: Visit the Arenal Observatory Lodge, birding on the lodge grounds, hummingbirds, trogons, monkeys and owls. The art workshops can happen in between the birding or arranged for the afternoon depending on the leader's preference. Lodging: Brisas del Arenal.

Day 7, Feb. 10: After breakfast head back to San Jose, on the way visit La Paz Valley, where the group will enjoy a new set of cloud forest

species including hummingbirds. Arrive to the hotel in the afternoon. Lodging: Bougainvillea.

Day 8, Feb. 11: Shuttle to international airport

7 Night/8 Day Itinerary:

Day 1 – February 4:

Meet your guide at the airport and drive to your hotel nearby. Rest of the day at leisure to enjoy the grounds of the hotel. Birding at the hotel gardens is a good way to start getting familiar with some of the common birds of Costa Rica and take some photographs. Some highlights might include Great Kiskadee, Lesson's Motmot, and Crimson-fronted Parakeet, Rufous-backed Wren, Melodious Blackbird and Rufous-tailed Hummingbird. The landscaping of the grounds of the lodge is superb, and the collections of bromeliads, orchids and more will keep participants very well entertained. In the evening meet with the group for a briefing and dinner.

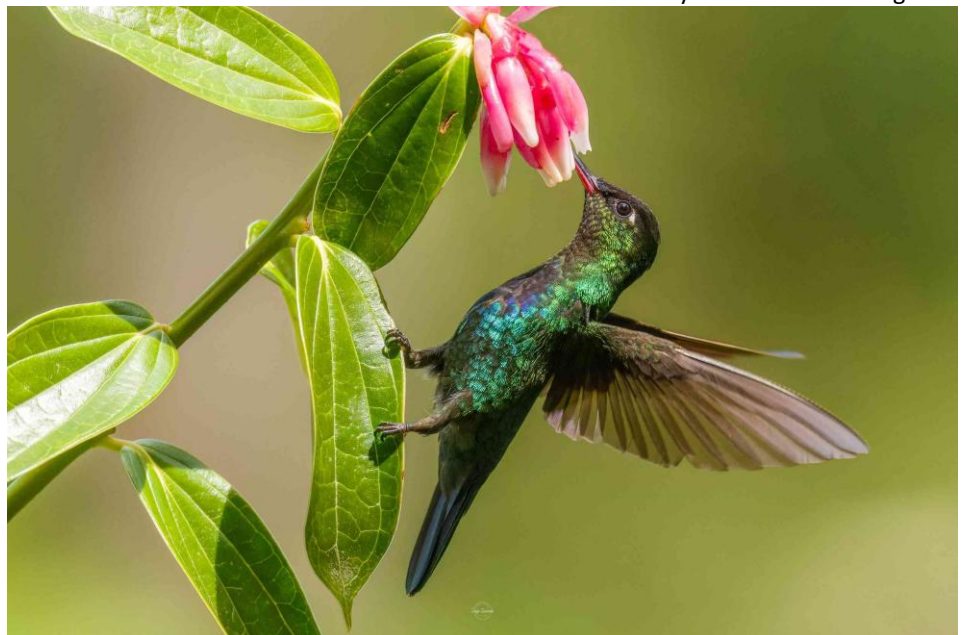
Lodging at Hotel Bougainvillea
Meals included: Dinner

Central Valley temperatures can vary with lows in the 60's and highs in the 90's.

Day 2 – February 5:

Drive to the highlands, en route stop at Paraiso de Quetzales to enjoy Highland species of hummingbirds. The group heads up to the Talamanca Highlands, the largest mountain range in the country, with its highest peaks reaching 12,000 ft elevation. The combination of mountain rainforest, oak and cloud forest along the way will make for breathtaking views. The species found along this mountain range are also spectacular, Resplendent Quetzal, Fiery-throated Hummingbird, Long-tailed Silky Flycatcher, Golden-browed Chlorophonia and Volcano Hummingbird to name a few. With a stop at Paraiso de Quetzales Lodge for lunch we will spend some time enjoying the

hummingbird feeders and gardens where we will get several of the highland endemics such as Fiery-throated Hummingbird, Talamanca Hummingbird, Volcano Hummingbird and Black-billed Nightingale-Thrush.

*Lodging at Gema del Bosque
Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

Temperatures can vary with lows on the 40's and highs on the 80's.

Day 3 – February 6:

Resplendent Quetzals and highland endemics. The photography setups at Batsu Gardens are perfect to enjoy and have another art workshop. Early start to go see one of the most sought-after birds in the world, the Resplendent Quetzal. Then return to the lodge and the rest of the morning there will be time for the art workshops at the grounds.

In the afternoon the group will visit Batsu Gardens, where the feeding stations offer a great variety of birds visiting constantly, and people will have time to sit and sketch. Some of the species for today also include Slaty Flowerpiercer, Flame-colored Tanager, Silver-throated Tanager, Flame-throated Warbler and Collared Redstart.

Day 4 – February 7:

In the morning walking along the beautiful waterfall trail with opportunities to sketch and enjoy the landscape and birds. In the afternoon visit the Paramo. The group will take a walk along the pristine Savegre river, the oak forest and surroundings are incredible and there are many opportunities to continue finding more of the regional endemics of the area. There will be time for art workshops and later the group will spend some time at the mountain top, experiencing the Paramo, a habitat located above the timberline, the vegetation has adapted to conditions of strong winds, high humidity and low temperatures. Still many species of birds and wildlife have found a home here, and species such as Volcano Junco, Peg-billed Finch, Talamanca and Volcano Hummingbirds are seen, to name a few.

*Lodging at Gema del Bosque
Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*

Day 5 – February 8:

Early birding at the lodge grounds and head towards Arenal area. Arrive to the lodge in the afternoon to relax and enjoy the grounds. This region is located in the Caribbean foothills of the mountain range, the predominant habitat is the rainforest, which varies its composition depending on the elevation. There will be stops along the way to enjoy some feeding stations with a different variety of birds such as Emerald, Bay-headed, Speckled Tanagers, Collared Trogon and Black-cheeked Woodpeckers to name a few. The town of La Fortuna rest on the foot of Arenal Volcano, the mountain reaches over 5,000 ft, but the town is located at 1,000ft approx. Once arrived to the lodge the group will have time to rest and relax, sketch and enjoy the grounds.

Meals included: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*

Day 6 – February 9:

Spend the day at Arenal Observatory Grounds. Visit the Arenal Observatory Lodge. Located on the foothills of the Tilaran Mountain range the place offers an amazing variety of habitats, on which the birding is fantastic. Starting at the feeders with Great Curassow, Montezuma Oropendola and Crested Guans, having their breakfast together with the Green and Red-legged Honeycreepers. Then walk along the gardens and trails where many species of hummingbirds, trogons, monkeys and coatis can be found. The art

workshops can happen in between the birding or arranged for the afternoon depending on the leader's preference.

Lodging at Brisas del Arenal

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Arenal Temperatures can vary with lows on the 70's and highs on the 90's.

Day 7 – February 10:

Head back to San José with a stop along the way to explore the Cloud Forest at La Paz, San Ramon. After breakfast head back to San Jose, on the way visit La Paz Valley, where the group will enjoy a new set of cloud forest species including hummingbirds such as Purple-throated Mountain Gem, Violet Sabrewing, Coppery-headed Emerald and many more. There will be a chance to do another art workshop while enjoying these species. Also, there will be time to look for one of the most incredible species for the trip the Sunbittern, with its amazing wing patterns, for sure a wonderful way to end the

trip. Arrive to the hotel in the afternoon.

Lodging at Bougainvillea

Meals included: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Day 8 – February 11:

Shuttle to international airport. After breakfast head towards the international airport for your flight.

Meals: Breakfast.

Included for the duration of this itinerary:

7 nights Lodging in double or single occupancy, private art instruction and guidance throughout, private guide services from day 1 through day 8, all ground transportation throughout, all meals from dinner day 1 through breakfast day 8, entrance fees to Nature Reserves and art/photography setups.
